Recent survey findings<sup>1</sup> defy conventional wisdom and illustrate that Rhode Island voters strongly support women's access to comprehensive reproductive health services and agree that Rhode Islanders' rights to make private medical decisions should be protected.

Planned Parenthood is extremely well-liked in Rhode Island with a majority of voters having a favorable opinion of Planned Parenthood (71% favorable, 45% very favorable). Planned Parenthood is viewed net favorably across demographic subgroups and party.

Voters are divided about whether they think their state legislature is more supportive or opposed to a woman making her own decision about abortion, or are unsure where the legislature stands. When it comes to their own state legislative member, Rhode Islanders are even more uncertain where their member stands on the matter of abortion. Of those who have an opinion, voters are more likely to think their state legislator is supportive than opposed.

Half of voters favor the 1973 Supreme Court *Roe v. Wade* decision (52% Favor, 42% strongly). When given an explanation that *Roe* v. *Wade* established a woman's constitutional right to have an abortion and limited the circumstances under which the government could restrict this right, over half of voters say they would not want to overturn the decision (53%).

Voters overwhelmingly believe that it is important for women in Rhode Island to have access to all of the reproductive health care options available to them (93% important, 76% very important). This belief is a core value and is equally true among both men and women.

Even when asked how important it is for women in Rhode Island to have access to all reproductive health care options including abortion, an overwhelming majority says it is important (85% important, 68% very important). Again, both men and women say it is very important for women to have access, with intensity stronger among women (76% say very important) than men (59% say very important).

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> Lake Research Partners designed and administered this survey that was conducted by telephone using professional interviewers April 28 – May 4, 2014. The survey reached a total of 500 Rhode Island Likely 2014 Voters. The margin of error for the total sample is +/-4.4%.

A majority of Rhode Islanders think three key reproductive health services - testing for HIV and sexually transmitted diseases, prescription birth control, and pregnancy-related services – should be included as preventive health care services, which means health plans would be required to fully cover these services without any out of pocket fees for patients, like co-pays. Voters are most likely to say that pregnancy-related services should be included (77% say should definitely be included) followed by testing for HIV and STD's (72%), and prescription birth control (61%).

Voters are very supportive of protecting the rights of Rhode Islanders when it comes to making medical decisions, with most voters agreeing that the state should pass a law that protects the right of residents to make private medical decisions, including the decision about an abortion, in the event that federal laws change (82% agree, 71% strongly agree).

This support is strong across demographic subgroups, including among Rhode Island Catholics (79% agree, 68% strongly agree), and across party lines with a solid majority of Democrats, Republicans, and Independents agreeing the right to make private medical decisions should be protected (94% of Democrats, 79% of Independents and 60% of Republicans agree).
